Eduardo Otero of Peralta, 85, passed away peacefully at his home on Friday, May 17, 2019. He was a life-long member of Our Lady of Guadalupe Catholic Church in Peralta, where he served as an usher for many years. Eduardo was a proud Army veteran who served at the end of the Korean War. Eduardo (Warre) worked for the Veteran's Administration Hospital for 32 years, starting as a nursing assistant and moving up to Supervisor of the Renal Dialysis Unit. He was a dedicated husband and father, hard-working, generous, honest, reliable, had strong conservative values, and a great sense of humor. Eduardo wanted nothing more than for his children to get a good education, instilling in them the value of integrity, discipline, and hard work. “ I remember our cousin Leon telling us, “You never had to wonder where you stood with your dad. He’d tell you.” Political-correctness was not part of his make-up. He told it like he saw it. There was a right way and a wrong way, his way was the right way. I think that’s rubbed off a little on all of us. He had a stern demeanor much of the time, making him a bit intimidating—or a lot to some. As my Uncle Pat said, “You can’t smile at your own kids until they’re adults.” But my dad also had a very tender side.

I remember going to visit him at his job one time when I was about eight-years-old with my friend Janet. I think we were at Lovelace with her mom for some reason and had some time to kill, so we went and visited our dads who worked at the V.A. He was so happy to see us. I remember his small office with lots of pictures of all of us kids, and him excitedly taking us around to meet his co-workers and his patients on renal dialysis. I’ll never forget how happy he was to see me, even though I saw him every day at home. There was a spring in his step.

I know that he spent a lot of time with his patients, talking to them, sitting with them as they had to spend hours a week connected to the dialysis machines. He was the kind of friend you wanted to have.

Family was very important to him. He would visit his aunts and uncles and cousins regularly even up until recently when he couldn’t really leave the house anymore. I remember him taking me on one of these visits when I was home from college, depressed and recovering from a traumatic incident and being so touched by his relationship with his Aunt Angela who was now living alone after her sister-roommate Sophie had recently died. She teared-up talking about Sophie. My dad listened to people, and he remembered everything, just like his dad.

He was really good with the sick, not only his patients, but all of us when we were sick. I was sick as a kid for almost a year when I turned nine and he would bring me crafts to do and made sure his family came to visit me. I remember seeing my school-picture on the visor of his truck. I’m sure he was praying for me. He took me and my brother Stephen to Disneyland that Summer. He was a great Dad.

He was also so proud when we had achievements. I’ll never forget when I got a writing job at Disney, I received a card from my Uncle Joe congratulating me, and he wrote that he’d never heard my dad happier than when he called him to tell him the news of my job.

I love you and miss you, Daddy. Thank you for sticking around for both of my son’s birthdays this year and for the monarch butterflies the day you passed. We’re going to continue to make you proud. I promise. Thank you.
