The world won't be the same without Rudy. He's one of the last true cowboys. This picture of him is absolutely perfect. True grit. Even John Wayne couldn't equal that image.

I will miss this man for a hundred reasons. I know that every time I sit by a fire and hear a harmonica, I'll hear his laughter. I know that if I ever want to feel his presence all I have to do is head out to Galisteo and his spirit will be everywhere. I know that I will NEVER know another man like that for the rest of my life.

That makes me both sad and grateful.
