Eddie James Lobato, age 69, passed away on May 7, 2017 in Albuquerque, NM. He was the sixth of eleven children.

Eddie enlisted in the United States Navy at the age of 18. He was deployed on the USS Enterprise, where he was injured during his tour of duty in the Vietnam War. He received the National Defense Service Medal for his loyal and brave service during a national emergency and he returned stateside on the USS Independence to be with his family. Eddie is preceded in death by his parents, Elmer J. Lobato and Josephine Baca Lobato; and six siblings, Emily, Clara, Annette, Elmer Jr., Gerald, and Jimmy. He is survived by one son, Danny; four siblings, Yvonne, Cecil, Marie, and John; and numerous nieces and nephews.
