Years later, I got married and eventually moved to my house on Mi Ranchito lane, and it was with great blessing to learn that Mr. and Mrs. Gabaldon were my neighbors accross the ditch. I used to watch them pass to the grocery store, church or wherever in his red and white truck. My boys would see them and sometimes stop them just to say hi, and see how they were, every once in a while, Mrs. Gabaldon would have a treat for the boys, you could see that they enjoyed talking to my boys.

When Mr. and Mrs. Gabaldon moved away, it broght us great sadness, my boys felt like they lost a friend, and I knew that I had lost some really good neighbors. Mr. Gabladon, may you rest in piece, and may God Bless you and keep you in his arms.
