Frank enjoyed working with his hands to create magnificent adobe structures. He could turn an ordinary space into something spectacular like his most recent couture salon for custom design, Stockton Hair Artist's on Montgomery Boulevard. Frank's most significant achievement was coming to know God thirty years ago. He considered himself a messenger of Jesus Christ from that day on and strived to be a brave representative of Christ engaging in missionary work in Mexico, New Guinea, and Africa. Frank was an open, energetic person who inspired those around him. He was also known by friends and family as a mentor, leader and teacher. He had soft hands, a compassionate heart, a wonderful sense of humor and an appreciation for simple pleasures like the fragrance of a flower or the beautiful colors of a bird. Frank was a loving husband, father and friend who accepted everyone for who they were.
